CIMARRON'S HISTORY

In 1979 Mike Harvey and wife Mary Lou opened a muzzle loading shop and sporting goods store in Houston, Texas known as "Bigfoot". Around this time he ordered plans for a Hawken rifle from a museum and built his first replica from scratch. By 1984 Mike had bought out Allen Firearms. Seeking to diversify their stock, Mike and Mary Lou began selling replica Old-West firearms, starting with percussion replicas, but soon included cartridge firearms. Around this time Bigfoot changed its' name to Cimarron Firearms Company.

"We ended up in Italy because there's this valley called Val Trompia, the 'Valley of the Trumpets', where they have been making arms since the Roman days." Mike recalled. He then began meeting with Aldo Uberti of Uberti Firearms in Brescia, Italy. Mike agreed with Colt in sensing that Aldo "was the best they had ever seen in understanding the art of the

gun, and how to capture that art." Aldo's son and partner Pietro, who was managing Uberti had a mutual respect for Mike and described him as "A pillar of the Uberti factory."

The gun that they started with was the Colt Single Action. Mike took an original from his collection to the Uberti factory and began shaping what they made to match the authentic Old West firearm. From the grip and frame shape, to authentic markings and eliminating the numerous proof marks that covered the guns. Harvey also had specific instructions regarding metal hardness, polishing and case hardening, ensuring that the quality, authenticity, accuracy, and durability of the firearms would be second to none.





Cimarron Firearms has since worked with other reputable manufacturers to always ensure *The Highest Standards* and remain the leader in quality and authenticity. Cimarron looks to the future with the addition of many more classic Old West rifles, shotguns, and handguns. Cimarron has also introduced original modern classics such as the Thunderer and Lightning models with their unique blend of classic features. In describing Cimarron's contribution to authentic cowboy guns, Old West historian Phil Spangenberger states, "To paraphrase the famed film director John Ford, 'If this isn't the way the old west six guns were, it's the way they should have been!"







CIMARRON DRAGOON REVOLVERS

"The Colt Paterson, Col. Sam's 1st revolver, was put to test by the Republic of Texas Rangers in the late 1830s. Armed with the new Patterson revolver, fifteen Rangers in central Texas, near San Antonio at Plum Creek, defeated a fierce band of 100 marauding Comanche warriors. The battle of Plum Creek made evident the need for Col. Colt's revolver on the American frontier. Regardless, in 1838 Colt was bankrupt. In 1846, Texas Ranger Captain Sam Walker sought help from Col. Colt to strengthen Texas' limited forces during the war with Mexico. The result was the production of the Colt Walker and the return of Col. Colt to the manufacturing of the great firearms pictured on these pages. No region and no state made a greater contribution than did Texas in the making of Col. Colt's Firearms Co. No firearm played a greater role than did the Colt revolver in the making of Texas and the opening of the American West."



CIMARRON 1851-1860-1861 REVOLVERS

The heyday of the two-gun man was the era of the percussion revolver, like Cimarron's replica Colt sixguns shown here. During the War Between the States, Confederate Rangers like John "the Grey Ghost" Singleton Mosby, and his Rebel raiders packed as many Army and/or Navy six-shooters as they could carry. Armed with six to eight revolvers each, these southern horsemen repeatedly struck the Yankee army hard and fast, then like the will-o'-the-wisp, quickly vanished into the landscape.

Out west, professional gunmen like Wild Bill Hickok, Wes Hardin, and the James-Younger gang made sure they had plenty of firepower at the ready for their deadly work! You too can be a two-gun pistoleer, like the colorful shootists of yesteryear. Strap on a brace of these cap and ball six-shooters and re-win the Wild West.




CIMARRON POCKET MODEL REVOLVERS

With the public clamoring for a quality, accurate pocket-sized weapon, Colt knew he could fulfill the need. By carefully studying the big Dragoon revolver and determining what features necessary in a large belt revolver could be removed from a smaller pocket-type pistol, he eliminated about 85 of the roughly 480 separate operations required to produce his earlier sixguns, thus creating the first pocket revolver made by Colt's facility in Hartford, Connecticut. Dubbed the "Baby Dragoon," and made without a loading lever, Colt turned out about 15,000 of them between 1847-1850, and the public loved them!

Because the Wells Fargo stage lines purchased some of these Baby Dragoons, collectors have named them the "Wells Fargo Model," nonetheless, they were so popular with the miners, expressmen and gamblers along San Francisco's Barbary Coast, that the Colt factory was unable to keep up with the orders. Cimarron makes this 4-inch octagon-barreled, 31 caliber, pocket pistol with the Standard Blue, Charcoal Blue, or their Original Finish, color case hardening, and a one-piece walnut stock and brass back strap and trigger guard. This little "five-shooter" is one that any sporting gent would be proud to slip into his waistband for an adventurous turn at the tables!





CIMARRON "THE BLUE & THE GRAY"

Cimarron Firearms pays tribute to the war between the states by creating The Blue and The Gray series. Each gun in the series features a sterling silver flag in the grip. These will be limited pieces so get yours while you still can!



CIMARRON CONVERSIONS

In 1871, Colt employee Charles Richards was awarded a patent for converting Colt percussion models to breech leading cartridge revolvers. The Richards cartridge conversion was an instant success. On July 2, 1872, William Mason, another Colt employee, was awarded a patent for an improvement to the Richards model. As percussion parts ran short, the 1860 Richards-Mason barrel was changed from the profile of the earlier percussion model to the sleek profile found on the 1871-72 Open Top.



CIMARRON THUNDERER®

To paraphruse the famed film director John Ford, "If this isn't the way the Old West sixguns were, it's the way they should have been!" The Thunderer", a full-sized Model P (peacemaker-style) single-action revolver that was designed by Cimarron Founder and President Mike B. Harvey and made on the Old Model (pre-1896) frame and "bullseye" ejector head. However, as a departure from the traditional peacemaker-style arm, this six-shooter utilizes the natty birds head grip, and is much like that carried by Val Kilmer's "Doc" Holliday in the 1993 hit Western, Tombstone. Cimarron's Thunderer" is available in the 4 3/4-inch barrel or the 5 1/2-inch barrel, as well as a 3 1/2-inch barreled version, that makes for a superb carry single action. This well-balanced smokewagon is offered in standard blue finish with the color case hardened frame and hammer, a .45 Colt, .45 Colt/.45 ACP dual cylinder, .44 Special, .44-40, .38 Special/.357 Magnum. The Cimarron Thunderer" is a daisy!

Cimarron's 7th Cavalry model in .45 Colt, is another great historical reproduction inspired by an original in our antique collection. It's a detail-perfect rendition of the single action of Custer's ill-fated 7th Cavairy's, legendary revolver. Each authentic 7 1/2-inch barreled, firearm is properly stamped with Ainsworth's OWA cartouche on the walnut stock, government proof marks and the inspector's initials are found in all of the appropriate locations and the last 4 numbers of the serial numbering is on the cylinder, as well as on the color case hardened frame, trigger guard and blued butt strap. The proper 2-line patent dates and the U.S. stamping is also found on the left side of the frame, as with genuine "Custer era" cavalry revolvers. This model is limited to just 2,000 units of each of Custer's five companies C, E, F, I, and L, that perished under his command at the Little Big Horn.

Cimarron's U.S. Cavalry Scout Model is an authentic copy of the 1873 single-action revolvers issued to these brave warriors in blue, reproduced directly from one of our antique collection's original litearms. Like the troopers' 7th Cavalry Model, this 7 1/2-inch barreled, 45 Colt caliber, full nickel-plated peacemaker-styled sixgun bears the OWA cartouche of 1870s military inspector Orville W. Ainsworth on the walnut grip. Other government proof and inspector's markings are stamped in the proper locations, as well as the 2-line patent dates, the U.S. stamp on the frame, and uses blued seriews and cylinder base pin


In 1898, the First Volunteer Cavalry, a colorful unit of cowboys and other adventurous young men was formed, with veteran Indian fighter Col. Leonard Wood in command and Lt. Col. Theodore Roosevelt second in command. Recruited in a San Antonio har and trained at Camp Wood in Texas in 1898, "Teddy" Roosevelt's "Rough Riders" would carry over 100 of these Artillery models when they bravely charged up San Juan Hill in Cuba.

Available in standard blue or Original Finish, our detail-perfect Artillery Model bears the government inspector Rinaldo A. CIMARRON 1860 HENRY RIFLES

Working with the design elements of the unsuccessful Volcanic rifle, an earlier attempt at producing a lever-action self-contained cartridge arm, Winchester plant Superintendent B. Tyler Henry designed this lever gun to handle his new .44 rimfire copper-cased cartridge. Despite only having produced somewhere around 14,000 Henrys between around 1862 and 1866, the gun was sought after by Civil War soldiers who could obtain one with a supply of ammunition. Nonetheless, this "Sixteen Shooter" proved itself in battle as well as on the frontier, and was used by many frontiersmen in the years right after the Civil War. It was used by Wells Fargo detective James Hume, Union Pacific Railroad and many other Old West notables, and more importantly, it paved the way for all future lever-action rifles up through modern times!

Having been reproduced directly from an original New Haven Arms Co. Henry, our Henry Rifle is considered by many gun savvy firearms enthusiasts as among the most handsome of all replica arms, in either the brass-framed model or the early-type Henry with the beautiful color case hardened frame, and sporting in authentically-styled, 24-inch octagonal barrel with the distinctive front-loaded tubular magazine, integrated into its shrouded barrel. The Cimarron Henry Rifle can be had in .44-40 centerfire or .45 Colt chambering, in Standard Blue, Charcoal Blue or Original Finish. Here's a museum-quality replica of a classic firearm.

Although only 1,731 of the revolutionary Henry repeating rifles were ordered by the U.S. government during the War Between the States, a number of private soldiers, as well as several regiments ordered these lever-action rifles through their own funds, such as those purchased by the celebrated 7th Illinois Infantry. Military-style Henry rifles bearing sling swivels and the stamped initials from government inspector Charles G. Chapman were also known to have been officially issued to the 1st Maine and the 1st District of Columbia Cavalry Regiments. Over 200 of these issue Henrys were captured from the 1st D.C. Regiment and in turn issued by the Confederates to their 7th, 11th and 35th Virginia Cavalry Regiments. The Rebs that faced them in the hands of Union soldiers dubbed them "that damned Yankee rifle that was loaded on Sunday and shot all week!"

Cimarron offers a dead ringer of these military Henry rifles, reproduced from an original in our antique collection! All Henry rifles were originally manufactured by the New Haven Arms Co., and like those 1860s-era rifles, our military reproduction comes complete with the original-type sling swivels, and C.G.C. inspector's stampings. Approved by the North South Skirmish Association (N-SSA), this 24-inch barreled rifle is available in either .44-40 or .45 Colt chambering, and is finished in Standard Blue, Charcoal Blue or Cimarron's Original finish. Whichever finish and caliber you decide on, you'll have a gun that looks like the genuine article.



CIMARRON 1866 RIFLES

Originally known as the "Improved Henry" due to its patented loading gate on the side of the frame and the addition of a wood forearm, the 1866 model was known as the "Yellow Boy" by the Native Americans, because of its brass frame. It was designed by Nelson King, Winchester's plant superintendent. The '66 model was the first true cowboy lever-action and the first that adapted well to carrying in a saddle scabbard, due to its slab sided design. With over 170,000 made between 1866-1898—it's popularity continued long after more powerful lever guns were introduced. The '66 model was famous worldwide, with guns used by the forces of Benito Juarez in Mexico, the Turkish army in their fight against the Russians and in the Wild West by such notables as Sioux Medicine Man Sitting Bull, the Union Pacific's chief engineer, General Grenville Dodge, and desperado Bill Doolin.



CIMARRON 1873 RIFLES

Arguably the most famous rifle of the Old West, Winchester's first centerfire arm was manufactured from 1873-1919, with more than 541,000 turned out before 1900. A frontier favorite since its debut, this lever-action rifle was produced in a number of variations from short Trapper models and carbines to short and extra-long barreled rifles. A few short years after the 1873 rifle was introduced it was often teamed with the famed 1873 Peacemaker and other sixguns that had been chambered for the '73's .44-40 (.44 WCF), .38-40 (.38 WCF), and .32-20 (.32 WCF) ammunition. The premier choice of the post-1874 Texas Rangers, this slab-sided saddle rifle was also favored by such well-known Westerners as Pat Garrett, William F. Cody, and outlaws Butch Cassidy, Belle Starr and Billy the Kid.

Originally dubbed the "Centennial Model," because of its introduction during America's 100th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence from British rule, and featured at Philadelphia's Centennial Exposition, this enlarged version of the famed 1873 Winchester was designed to handle stronger loads than its predecessor. With nearly 64,000 made from 1876-1897, the big '76 was one of the few lever-action rifles used by the buffalo hunters. It was a favorite with many big-game hunters of the era and was a favorite with future president Theodore Roosevelt.



CIMARRON 1892, 1894 & MODEL 71 RIFLES

The Cimiliron Model 1892 rifle is manufactured on John Browning's patents of 1884, the same patents covering the earlier and larger Model 1886 rifle. The 1892 was introduced by Winchester to replace the aging 1873 Model and was made in popular calibers proven in the Model 1873.



Cimarron Firearms is proud to offer the Model 1894, one of the most beloved hunting and saddle rifles of all time. It was the first rifle to chamber the smokeless powder round, the ,30-30 WCF. Cimarron has reproduced this classic rifle down to the last detail. Now is your chance to retire your grandpa's of '94 and get your own!



With the discontinuance of Winchester's famed 1886 model, in 1935 the company created one of the classic 20th century big-game rifles by modifying the old '86 into the Model 71. Made in half magazine configuration with a pistol grip stock, this Browning-designed, 5-shot lever-action quickly became the rifle of choice and was very effective against any North American big game—including Canada and Alaska.



With nearly 64,000 of them made before 1899, the gun was carried by Arizona Sheriff John Slaughter, and the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad issued '87s to its messengers. Made from an original in our collection, Cimarron's 1887 Lever Action Shotgun comes with either a 22, or 28-inch round blued burrel, a color case hardened receiver, in 12 gauge and capable of handling 2 3/4-inch shotshells. Who could forget Arnold's 1887 model in the Sci-Fi action thriller Terminator 2: Judgment Day?




John M. Browning's first slide or pump-action shotgan became Winchester's 1893 model, designed to handle black powder shotshells. However, after encountering some mechanical difficulties and the fact that it was unable to bandle the then-new smokeless powder armitantion, a similar looking, but redesigned and improved model—the famed 1897 pump shotgan—was brought out. The 1897 Winchester was not only an immediate success with both civilian hunters, but the military as well, and with well over a million '97s produced between 1897-1957, this scattergan was the best selling slide-action shotgan on the market and is undoubtedly the most famous pump shotgan of all time!



CIMARRON SHOTGUNS

The single best, and most economical arm for hunting and defense in the Old West was the side by side, double-barreled shotgun. Scores of thousands of these sidebammer scattergums were a mainstay to settlers, miners, ranchers, gunfighters, and virtually anyone who needed a weapon. In times of civil unrest, many lawmen considered the scattergum as the best town tarner and express companies especially realized the value of these smoothbores and armed their messengers with them. They each knew the threat of scattered shot from a shotgum's blast had a greater chance of dissuading an unruly crowd or a road agent, than would the single projectile from a rifle or pistol.

Cimarron's 1878 Coach Gun, inspired by an original in our collection, is available in either the full-length 26-inch barrel, or the 20-inch barreled model, both capable of handling 3-inch shotshells, with the traditional exposed sidehammers, a pistol grip stock and schnabble forearm, blued burrels and a color case hardened receiver. When you ride shotgun, ride with a Cimarron 1878 Coach Gun.



By the 1880s, shotguns with internal hammers began to appear in the firearms marketplace, and rather than to have to cock the hammers manually, the internal hammers were automatically cocked when the barrels were brought to the closed position, and a sliding safety, mounted on the gan's top tang was added to the gan. Sleek and smooth handling, these so-called "hammerless" scatterguns quickly overshadowed the older exposed hammer smoothbores, offering faster firing—an important factor in the lethal shootouts that occurred in the latter part of the Wild West era, as well as in Cowboy Action and Cowboy Mounted Shooting competitions today!

Cimarron's 1889 models are offered in either 12 gauge or .410 bore size, in 18-inch, 20-inch or 22-inch, round side by side, blued barrels, and can be had with either a broad fore-end or the splinter-style fore-end. Equipped with a thick and comfortable black butt pad with a white line spacer, our single trigger 1889 model is quickly becoming a favorite with today's Cowboy Sport shooters and other shotgum fans.




